Supplies: whistle, coin, referee wallet, pen, digital watch, two flags



Pre-Game Instructions from the Referee to Assistant Referees:

Follow USSF standard procedures plus any special instructions from the referee

1. Kick-Off: Count players, check goalkeeper is ready, then signal referee.



Signal, wait for whistle, then indicate ball placement. 3. Throw-in: Signal ball out of play for entire touch line and goal line. On your half of the touch line, signal



- direction. On the referee half, mirror the referee's signal. 4. Follow the ball all the way to the goal line.
- 5. Goal scored: run up the touch line. Not a goal: stand like a statue.
- 6. Fouls: Signal fouls that are reasonably near to you that you believe the referee would have called if they had seen.



- 8. Administrative duties:
- Time keeping Back up referee
- Substitutions Follow standard procedures
- 9. Communication: Referee will make eye contact at mos stoppages, indicate all ok.
- 10. We will walk onto and off the field together.

Referee Pre- and Post-Game Responsibilities

- 1. Arrive 30 minutes early
- 2. Inspect field (especially goals) for safety hazards
- 3. Meet coaches, inspect teams and get game cards and game balls*
- 4. Pre-game instructions to ARs*
- 5. Conduct coin toss*
- 6. Check with ARs that teams are ready
- 7. Half-time review with ARs
- 8. Supervise teams' post-game handshake
- 9. Complete and submit game card
- *These can be completed on the side before the prior game ends.



"The Laws of the Game are intended to provide that games should be played with as little interference as possible, and in this view it is the duty of referees to penalize only deliberate breaches of the Law. Constant whistling for trifling and doubtful breaches produces bad feelings and loss of temper on the part of the players and spoils the pleasure of spectators."

Point direction of throw-in

FOUL NOT SEEN BY REF

Raise with slight wiggle, after ref eye contact, indicate restart direction

GOAL KICK

Point toward goal area using right hand



OFFSIDE LOCATION

OFFSIDE Hold flag straight up

Center



Point toward near corner



Referee Signals

INDIRECT FREE KICK

Hold until another player touches, ball goes out or ball obviously not going into goal

FREE KICK Point in restart direction

CORNER KICK

Facing the goal line, point to correct corner

THROW IN

Point direction of throw-in
